CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Pro-Tem Trena McRary Kirby called the meeting to order.

PLANNER'S STAFF REPORT

PARKS TEXT AMENDMENT PROPOSAL

Status: Parks are usually beneficial, but in the current ordinance parks are lumped in the "public service facilities" category which includes water treatment plants and police stations, and they are disallowed in the R-20 district. Parks should probably be allowed in every district. **On February 3, the Planning Board recommended approval** of the text amendment as proposed.

Consistency with Comprehensive Plan:

The Sawmills Comprehensive Plan wants to expand parks and greenways. Specifically it says "consider an additional small community park somewhere along Sawmills School Road". Allowing parks in the R-20 district would make it easier for the town to find locations for new parks in accordance with the Comprehensive Plan. (Although the Town has no plans to build another park at this time.)

PARKS TEXT AMENDMENT PROPOSAL

§ 153.005 DEFINITIONS

PUBLIC SERVICE FACILITY. The use of land, buildings, or structures by a municipal or county agency to provide protective, administrative, maintenance and social services for the general public, including water treatment plants, sewage treatment plants, resources recovery facilities, parks and recreation facilities, police and fire stations, municipal buildings, community centers and other similar public structures and facilities.

PARK. A place for the general public to use for active or passive recreation. A park shall be mainly free-of-charge to the general public.



§ 153.163 MINIMUM OFF-STREET PARKING REQUIREMENTS.

The following off-street parking spaces shall be required:
