RECYCLE REWARDS WINNER: Town Administrator Seth Eckard announced Robert Phillips as the February Recycle Rewards winner. A credit of twenty-eight dollars (\$28.00) will be added to Mr. Phillips sanitation bill and his certificate will be available at the Town Hall for pick up.

PLANNING MATTERS:

CALL A PUBLIC HEARING TO ADOPT A TEXT AMENDMENT TO SECTIONS 153.190-153.197 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES: Town Planner Elinor Hiltz stated effective October 1, 2013 the state law has changed regarding Board of Adjustment procedures. Local governments must amend their zoning ordinances to match state law. The Planning Board reviewed sections 153.190-153.197 of the Code of Ordinances and recommends Council call for a public hearing.

Trena McRary Kirby made a motion, and Joe Wesson seconded, to call for a public hearing on March 18, 2014 at 6:00 pm at the Sawmills Town Hall to discuss a text Amendment to sections 153.190-153.197 of the Code of Ordinances. All were in favor.

ADOPT A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT FOR THE W.P.C.O.G. INVESTING IN MANUFACTURING COMMUNITIES PROGRAM APPLICATION: Administrator Eckard asked Council to adopt a Resolution in support of a program application for investing in manufacturing communities.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT MONTHLY STATUS REPORT: Administrator Eckard stated the enclosed monthly status report for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) shows that all requirements are on schedule for the Haystation, LLC.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT SEWER PROJECT MONTHLY UPDATE: Administrator Eckard stated in a memo from Lisa Helton, Program Administrator with the Western Piedmont Council of Governments, that the Town has received the release of funds letter from the Department of Commerce. This allows the Town to be reimbursed for expenses incurred from the sewer project. West Consultants, PLLC is finishing the required surveying work for the easements. When that process is complete the bidding process will start.



PLANNER'S STAFF REPORT

BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT STATUTORY CHANGES

Status: Effective October 1, 2013 the state law has changed regarding Board of Adjustment procedures. Local governments must amend their zoning ordinances to match state law. The Planning Board recommended approval of this zoning ordinance text amendment on February 4th. The call for a public hearing occurred on February 18th, 2014.

Proposal: A subcommittee of land use lawyers from the NC Bar Association and the legislature's zoning subcommittee spearheaded this effort for the NC legislature to overhaul the Board of Adjustment State Statutes for benevolent reasons: to make the rules clearer and consistent for every town and county statewide. These are the significant revisions that may interest Sawmills:

1.hearings do not have to be advertised in newspaper anymore

2.town clerk may administer oaths

3.chairperson of the BOA may issue subpoenas

4.in variances, "practical difficulty" is changed to "unnecessary hardship" and

"unnecessary hardship" is defined

5.a 4/5 vote is required for variances, but only a simple majority is required to rule on

appeals and conditional use permits

6.a neighbor can appeal a zoning decision whenever they find out about the project; it may be after construction has started. If the developer is afraid someone might appeal and they would rather achieve closure sooner, the developer can post a sign saying "Future site of PDQ", and then the neighbor only has 30 days from then to appeal.

Planner's Recommendation

The ordinance should be amended so Board of Adjustment decisions do not get reversed in court.

Consistency with Comprehensive Plan:

Sawmills Comprehensive Plan does not cover Board of Adjustment proceedings, but towns need legally-functioning boards to make zoning determinations and zoning is a useful tool for future land-use planning.
